PENN OHIO PRO STOCK CHAMPIONSHIP TOURING SERIES
MEMBER CHRIS SCHNEIDER!**

September 1, 2016 (Sandy Lake, PA) The Homak Penn Ohio Pro Stock Championship Touring Series was able to complete their fifth event of the 2016 Season after several attempts were unsuccessful due to rain. On Friday, August 26th, 27 stock cars showed up at Raceway 7 to battle for the \$500 to-win plus \$500 bonus to-win for touring series' members. Outside pole sitter and current touring series' point leader, Chris Schneider, battled Brandon Groters for the first seven laps before taking over the lead on lap eight at the flag and cruising his way to victory lane.

Groters and Schneider led a pack of 24 cars to the green. Groters quickly took the lead over Schneider with Randy Wyant securing third over Don McGuire and Chris McGuire in fourth and fifth, respectively. These positions would stay the same until lap 8 when Schneider was able to make the pass on Groters at the flag. One lap later the leaders caught lap traffic, but had no problem maintaining their positions with Schneider leading over Groters, Wyant, and the McGuires. The caution flag flew with 15 laps complete and a single file restart had

Schneider leading the group with the top five remaining in check for one lap. Lap 16 found Tony Spaghetti experiencing mechanical woes bringing out the caution flag.

With the field bunched back up, the single file restart had Schneider maintain the lead over the 22 cars still in the race. Groters, Wyant and Don McGuire continued to hold onto second through fourth while Bobby Whitling took the fifth spot from Chris McGuire on lap 18. The third and final caution flag flew on lap 19 for a slowed Garrett Calvert. The caution gave Groters a shot to take back the lead with the field bunched up, but Schneider was too strong and pulled away to the \$1,000 victory. Schneider's win came in his SS Chassis & Supply/Nick Chevrolet/It's All Clean-sponsored #55.

Groters maintained the runner-up spot over Randy Wyant for third. Don McGuire was fourth and the winner of the American Racer tire presented by Lias Tire. Bobby Whitling captured fifth over Chris McGuire in sixth, while Jackson Humanic, Rusty Martz, Rod Laskey, and Shaun Fawcett completed the top 10. Heat winners over the 27-car field were Martz, Whitling, Don McGuire and Fawcett.

With 5 races left on the touring series' schedule, the point battle is heating up. Two-time point champion, Chris Schneider, is in the top spot with 396 points just 29 points over Bobby Whitling. Brent Johnson sits in the third spot 4 points behind Bobby Whitling. Brian Rhed is in fourth followed by Rob Shook for fifth. Just half the races are in so it's still anyone's championship to capture.
